Subject: Re-launch of Modified Direct Benefit Transfer for LPG Consumers (DBTL) Scheme

Madam(s)/ Sir(s),

I am directed to inform that Union Cabinet in its meeting held on 18.10.2014 decided to re-launch of Modified Direct Benefit transfer for LPG Consumers (DBTL) Scheme from 15.11.2014 in 54 districts (list enclosed) and in the entire country from 1.1.2015.

2. Further a meeting was held in the Prime Minister's office on 22.10.2014 on issues relating to DBTL.

3. It has been decided as under:

(i) Multiple approaches will be used for seeding LPG databases with bank accounts and Aadhaar numbers. Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) will collect Aadhaar numbers and Bank account details at LPG distributors and through drop boxes at other locations. Bankers could also use the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana methodology and data collected to assist in the seeding process.

(ii) Two modes of seeding of bank accounts in LPG database will be implemented by banks/ NPCI as under:

(a) Bank accounts details captured by OMCs and bank account information (account number + IFSC + name of account holder) will be sent to banks electronically via NPCI and banks will confirm the veracity of the information as per their records. Thereafter OMCs can seed that bank account information in the LPG database.

(b) LPG consumer can approach banks directly. LPG consumer ID will be captured by banks at the bank branches against the bank account and the pair of LPG consumer ID details and bank account information will be then electronically sent bank to OMCs by banks.

(iii) The mechanism to seed LPG consumer ID against the bank account number at bank branches as an important alternative mechanism (para 3(ii) (b) above) to be rolled out in as many branches as feasible prior to scheme launch on 15.11.2014 and most banks by 1.1.2015.


(iv) Also verification of bank details submitted by the OMCs via NPCI as an alternative method may also be rolled out prior to scheme launch (para 3(ii) (a) above).

4. This approach was also discussed in the Video Conference of 28.10.2014 with banks.

5. In view of the foregoing, it is requested to ensure the preparedness of your banks, particularly in the 54 districts, for the smooth re- launch of the modified DBTL.
