DRT Section

The Debts Recovery Tribunals (DRTs) and Debts Recovery Appellate Tribunal (DRATs) were established under the Recovery of Debts Due to Banks and Financial Institutions Act (RDDBFI Act),1993 with the specific objective of providing expeditious adjudication and recovery of debts due to Banks and Financial Institution. Prior to the establishment of the DRTs/DRATs, the process of recovery of debts used to be quite protracted and cumbersome. In the year 1990, more than 15 lakh cases filed by Banks and Financial Institutions were pending before various courts involving an amount of more than Rs. 6,000 crore. With the establishment of DRTs/DRATs, the recovery position has improved. The DRTs are on an average disposing off more than 11,000 cases involving an amount of around Rs. 21,000 crore every year.

DEBTS RECOVERY APPELLATE TRIBUNAL (DRAT)

At present, there are 5 DRATs functioning at Allahabad, Chennai, Delhi, Kolkata and Mumbai.

DRAT is the appellate authority to hear and dispose of appeals arising out of the decisions of the DRTs. The DRAT is presided by the Chairperson. The term of Chairperson DRAT is 5 years or up to the age of 65 years, whichever is earlier. A person qualified to be a judge of the High Court or who has been a Member of the Indian Legal Service and his held a post in Grade-I of the service for at least three years or who has held the post of Presiding Officer of DRT for a minimum period of three years can be appointed as the Chairperson of DRAT. The Chairperson of DRAT exercises general power of superintendence and control over DRTs under his jurisdiction.

At present, all the posts of Chairperson, DRAT are filled. The names of the incumbents along with their tenure is as under:

DEBTS RECOVERY TRIBUNAL (DRT)

At present, there are 33 DRTs functioning at various parts of the country. 6 New DRTs are also being established at Bengaluru, Chandigarh, Dehra Dun, Ernakulam, Hyderabad and Siliguri.

The DRT is presided by Presiding Officer and the term of the Presiding Officer is 5 years or up to the age of 62 years, whichever is earlier. A person qualified to be a District judge can be appointed as a Presiding Officer of DRT.

Out of the 33 posts of Presiding Officer, two are lying vacant and six new posts of Presiding Officer for 6 new DRTs are also to be filled. The names of the incumbents along with their tenure is as under:

APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRPERSON OF DRAT/PRESIDING OFFICER OF DRT

As per the Rules framed under the RDDBI Act, the Chairperson of DRAT or the Presiding Officer of DRT is selected by a Selection Committee consisting of:

- (a) Chief Justice of India or a Judge of the Supreme Court nominated by the Chief Justice
- (b) Secretary, Department of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Finance
- (c) Secretary, Department of Legal Affairs, Ministry of Law
- (d) Secretary of Department of Financial Services.
- (e) Governor, RBI or Deputy Governor nominated by the Governor

GROUP 'A' OFFICERS AND SUPPORT STAFF IN DRT/DRAT

Besides the Presiding Officer, each DRT consists of 4 Group 'A' Officers namely, Registrar one; Assistant Registrar - one and Recovery Officers - two. The DRAT consists of a Secretary/Registrar, the only Group 'A' Officer. These posts are filled up on deputation. The Group 'A' Officers are selected by a Selection Committee headed by the Joint Secretary supervising the work of DRT Section; two Directors/ Deputy Secretary level officers including the Deputy Secretary/ Director in charge of DRT Section and Deputy Legal Adviser from RBI.

Each DRT and DRAT is provided with Group 'B', 'C' and 'D' staff for which separate recruitment rules have been framed for each DRT/DRAT

REMOVAL OF CHAIRPERSON, DRAT/PRESIDING OFFICER, DRT

The Chairperson of a DRAT or a Presiding Officer of a DRT can be removed from his office by the Central Government on grounds of proved misbehavior or incapacity after an inquiry by the Judge of the High Court in case of Presiding Officer and by a Judge of the Supreme Court in case of Chairperson of DRAT.
